### MY TRIBUTE TO BERT KUIPER – A BUILDER OF A GRACIOUS LEGACY

It was 25 years ago that my Heavenly Father's eternal wisdom usurped our temporal wishes. The pain of losing a father can never be healed – not even by time. That is what Heaven is for. But we are not victims of these tragedies. By the grace of God we become victors in Christ through them.

For all practical purposes it was a car accident that instantly changed my life as a young seminarian. Yet, God foreknew this event and providence has no paralyzing pity parties, just hope in the midst of pain and a profound and curious hunger for Heaven.

The doctrine of the sovereignty of God is not just a theological idea but also the psychological wire I live on. It balances my hope and humility as it guides me to confident living in time and eternity.

This is my tribute to my father:

Bert A. Kuiper was a faithful man to his worship, work, and witness. Even though he was a fallen

man, cursed and affected by the fall. He was also a redeemed man. Redeemed by:

- ▲ The sovereign will of God,
- ▲ The loving blood atonement of Jesus Christ,
- ▲ The power of being born again by the Holy Spirit.

As I read so many depressing statistics in books and sociological studies, and as I hear first hand accounts from men in my small groups of miserable childhoods, hurtful stories of failed fathers, abandonment of fathers to their spiritual and financial obligations - I thank God for Bert A. Kuiper all the time. He never abdicated his God ordained role of spiritual leader in my life.

Bert Kuiper was:

- 1) **My Favorite Catechism Teacher.**
  - ✎ Wednesday nights were church night and he not only brought us but also taught us with discipline & delight.
- 2) **The Man Who Read the Bible to Me.**
  - ✎ My Dad read the Bible at suppertime and my mother would read it to us at lunchtime. Both my parents made sure we were in and knew our Sunday school. They took us to church, they didn't suggest it or get to it when they had time. My Dad made time for God's priorities in our family.
- 3) **A Worker Who Took Me to Work.**
  - ✎ He took time to take me, a lazy daydreaming boy, with him to work with the objective of turning me into a **working man**. It was frustrating to say the least but there was no other option and we both knew it. He ran his own business and paid his bills on time. He modeled manhood and a working man to me.
- 4) **The Provider & Protector of Me and Our Family.**
  - ✎ I never worried, I never wondered, I never thought there was any possibility of not having plenty of food, a beautiful home to live in, and both parents in the house when I came home at any age. In fact I just assumed he'd be always there.

Now he's gone. He didn't want me to be a certain kind of person, just a kind person. Every child blessed by great parents like I've had is given a template and mold to love the next generation. I hope you can give your parents a tribute also, this is mine to a man who looms larger as my

time in this life gets thinner. My tribute to him is to model the discipline and delight he modeled. I had no trauma nor do I have physical or emotional scars. I have spiritual and material blessings & benefits from his benevolence.

All because he was what D.A.D.S. should be:

**A**ffirming  
**D**irecting  
**S**acrificing



**Why We Call God 'Father'**

**Christians have good reasons to resist gender-neutral alternatives.**

*Not an Invention*

... If patriarchy is responsible for cultures portraying God as male, then we would expect goddess worship to reflect a matriarchal society—one in which women are given superior status or at least are equal to men. But this is not the case. Even today, many societies devoted to goddess worship remain oppressive toward women. Devotion to the goddess Kali in Hinduism, for instance, has never resulted in better treatment of women, even among Kali devotees....

In the New Testament, God's fatherhood conveys two distinct ideas. First, it refers primarily to the internal relationship within the Trinity. This is how the first article of the Apostles' Creed puts it: "I believe in God, the Father Almighty, the Maker of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord." Even as early as Paul's writings, the phrase "God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ" had become commonplace. God is first and foremost the *Father* of our Lord Jesus Christ. This is not an invention of later church leaders, but comes directly from Christ, who refers to God as "Father." In doing so, Jesus reveals a unique relationship between the Father and Son that constitutes the beginning of the Trinitarian doctrine.

Jesus taught his disciples to call God "our heavenly Father." Therefore, the loving relationship he has with the Father from eternity now extends to those adopted into God's family (Rom. 8:15). The father-son relationship is the most intimate personal relationship, one marked by reciprocal love and respect, and it is God's supremely personal and loving nature that the term *father* is meant to underscore....

Second, the father metaphor points to God as the Creator (e.g., Isa. 64:8; Mal. 2:10) "from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name" (Eph. 3:15). *Father* captures in one word two seemingly contrasting characteristics: God's love for his creatures and his lordship over all creation. ... Calling God *Mother* undermines the Christian doctrine of creation by implying that God and the world are made of the same stuff and virtually indistinguishable. So, we need *Father* in order to get to the right doctrine of creation.

The Decline of Marriage And Rise of New Families

Changes in marital patterns have had a major impact on the lives of children in this country. **Marriage is no longer considered a prerequisite for parenthood.**

- △ Over the past 50 years, the share of children born to unmarried mothers has risen dramatically—increasing eightfold from 5% in 1960 to 41% in 2008.
- △ This trend has contributed to the decrease in the share of children under age 18 living with two married parents – to 64% in 2008 from 87% in 1960.<sup>4</sup>

In his book, *The Marriage Go-Round*, Andrew Cherlin argues that Americans' relatively high rates of marriage and divorce as well as the short-term nature of their cohabiting relationships have all contributed to a great deal of instability in family life.<sup>13</sup>

Christians have long recognized that God often uses family worship to bring reformation and revival to the church. For example, the 1677 church covenant of the Puritan congregation in Dorchester, Massachusetts, included the commitment “to reform our families, engaging ourselves to a conscientious care to set before us and to maintain the worship of God in them; and to walk in our houses with perfect hearts in a faithful discharge of all domestic duties, educating, instructing, and charging our children and households to keep the ways of the Lord.”

**What Is the Gospel?** by [R.C. Sproul](#)

There is no greater message to be heard than that which we call the Gospel. But as important as that is, it is often given to massive distortions or over simplifications. People think they're preaching the Gospel to you when they tell you, 'you can have a purpose to your life', or that 'you can have meaning to your life', or that 'you can have a personal relationship with Jesus.' All of those things are true, and they're all important, but they don't get to the heart of the Gospel.

The Gospel is called the 'good news' because it addresses the most serious problem that you and I have as human beings, and that problem is simply this:

☞ God is holy and He is just, and I'm not. And at the end of my life, I'm going to stand before a just and holy God, and I'll be judged. And I'll be judged either on the basis of my own righteousness – or lack of it – or the righteousness of another.

The good news of the Gospel is that Jesus lived a life of perfect righteousness, of perfect obedience to God, not for His own well being but for His people. **He has done for me what I couldn't possibly do for myself.** But not only has He lived that life of perfect obedience, He offered Himself as a perfect sacrifice to satisfy the justice and the righteousness of God.

The great misconception in our day is this: that God isn't concerned to protect His own integrity. He's a kind of wishy-washy deity, who just waves a wand of forgiveness over everybody. **No. For God to forgive you is a very costly matter. It cost the sacrifice of His own Son.** So valuable was that sacrifice that God pronounced it valuable by raising Him from the dead – so that Christ died for us, He was raised for our justification.

**So the Gospel is something objective.** It is the message of who Jesus is and what He did. **And it also has a subjective dimension.** How are the benefits of Jesus subjectively appropriated to us? How do I get it? The Bible makes it clear that we are justified not by our works, not by our efforts, not by our deeds, but by faith – and by faith alone. The only way you can receive the benefit of Christ's life and death is by putting your trust in Him – and in Him alone. You do that, you're declared just by God, you're adopted into His family, you're forgiven of all of your sins, and you have begun your pilgrimage for eternity.





† We also do “The Purpose Driven Life” followed by “A Life God Rewards” and ending with an in depth study of the epistle of Ephesians and Galatians using the “Journibles”. While we are doing this I teach them my goals and time management system: “The “Grace Life Pacer”.

† When we don't have a guest the men write out summaries of what they believe. The tool we use is something I put together for called the “Jedidiah Journal: Discovering, Developing and Deploying your Gifts and Talents for Time & Eternity.” Michelle and I will be working with the core group to get started. Because Bill is a full time professor the hope to get a committed core group started and call an APR new Church start pastor who will do the full time pastoring and preaching. The ARP is principle driven and meet a strategic presence in west Michigan while our more established denominations minimize, criticize, and ostracizes men who hold firmly to the Bible's authority as understood by the classic reformed confessions.
